Wildlife and Culture of Chitwan - Itinerary

Day 1: Arrival in Chitwan and Jungle Walk

- 1. Arrive in Chitwan and check into your hotel
- 2. Take a jungle walk with a naturalist guide to explore the surrounding area
- 3. Learn about the local flora and fauna and spot some of the wildlife that lives in the park

Day 2: Elephant Safari and Tharu Cultural Program

- 1. Start the day with an early morning elephant safari to explore deeper into the jungle
- 2. Return to the hotel for breakfast
- 3. In the evening, enjoy a Tharu cultural program, which showcases the traditional dances and songs of the Tharu community, who have lived in the Chitwan region for generations

Day 3: Canoe Ride and Bird Watching

- 1. Take a peaceful canoe ride on the Rapti River and observe the local birdlife
- 2. Return to the hotel for breakfast
- 3. After breakfast, go bird watching with a naturalist guide to spot some of the many bird species that inhabit the park

Day 4: Jeep Safari and Departure

- 1. Take a jeep safari to explore some of the more remote areas of the park
- 2. Return to the hotel for breakfast
- 3. Check out of your hotel and depart from Chitwan National Park
