Trip to Kathmandu with Chitwan - Itinerary

Day 1: Arrival in Kathmandu

Upon arrival at Tribhuvan International Airport in Kathmandu, you'll be greeted by your tour guide and transferred to your hotel. Spend the rest of the day at leisure, exploring the city on your own or resting up for the adventure ahead.

Day 2: Kathmandu Sightseeing

After breakfast, embark on a full-day sightseeing tour of Kathmandu. Visit UNESCO World Heritage Sites like Swayambhunath Stupa (also known as the Monkey Temple), Boudhanath Stupa, and Pashupatinath Temple. You'll also have the chance to explore the colorful streets of Thamel, the tourist hub of Kathmandu.

Day 3: Kathmandu to Chitwan

After breakfast, drive from Kathmandu to Chitwan National Park (approximately 5 hours). Upon arrival in Chitwan, check in to your hotel and take some time to relax. In the evening, enjoy a cultural program featuring local music and dance.

Day 4: Chitwan National Park

After breakfast, take a canoe ride on the Rapti River to spot crocodiles and birds. Then, go on a jungle walk with an experienced guide to learn about the flora and fauna of Chitwan National Park. After lunch, take an

elephant back safari to see the park's famous one-horned rhinos and other wildlife.

Day 5: Chitwan National Park

Today, take part in an elephant bathing program and learn about the conservation efforts being undertaken at Chitwan National Park. In the afternoon, visit a nearby Tharu village to learn about their unique culture and traditions.

Day 6: Departure from Chitwan

After breakfast, check out of your hotel and drive back to Kathmandu (approximately 5 hours). Upon arrival in Kathmandu, you'll be transferred to the airport for your departure flight.

1. How far is Chitwan from Kathmandu?

Chitwan is approximately 165 kilometers (103 miles) from Kathmandu, and it takes around 5-6 hours to drive between the two cities.
